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FROM THE SENIOR PASTOR Tim Flint

Welcome to the 2023 Annual Report for Wagga Wagga Evangelical Church! The aim of this report is to give an insider's view of some of the significant things that have happened in the life of our church family in 2023. As the Senior Pastor, I'm delighted to reflect on and read the contributions of so many of our members and am grateful to God for the way He continues to act in, on and through us as a church, for His glory.

A significant and positive change at the beginning of 2023 was the addition of Mitch Kingsland and Dave Shannon to our pastoral staff team. Mitch, with the support of Hannah, started his twoyear MTS apprenticeship with us in early January. Dave, with the support of Emily, began an Associate Pastor position with us midway through January. The combined contribution of Mitch, Dave and their families has been an incredible blessing of God to our church. In terms of character, conviction, chemistry, capacity and competency (you all know I love alliteration), these men and their families have been exemplary. We can, and should, all praise God for the way He has gifted them to help deepen us all as disciples of Jesus. This change in staff roles and dynamics has also meant that some of our 2023 goals needed to be altered or paused as we rightly allowed time for them to settle in and begin to understand the role they play in church life. We also intentionally dedicated time to re-clarify our **Purpose**, **Vision** and **Values** as a church (more on this in the *Future Focus* section). This will prayerfully help us to be more effective in working toward generational gospel witness and growth in Wagga Wagga.

The growth of our staff team has also included the addition of more high level volunteers giving significant time to ministry and leadership. Whilst these people ask not to be mentioned by name, it is right that we acknowledge the contribution they make and recognise it as a fabulous example of kingdom priorities lived out. Praise God! As we continue to grow, we will continually need to be identifying and training people for volunteer leadership from within

our church family. We do so trusting that Jesus equips His body with every gift necessary for growing us in unity, maturity and servant-heartedness (Eph 4:11).

As you read on, please do so with great thanks in your heart for God's grace to us in Christ. Praise Him and pray for His steady hand to guide us in 2024 as we continue to live out our purpose...to make and mature disciples of Jesus!



THE 5 M'S

Magnification, Membership, Maturity, Mission, Ministry

The Christian life is a journey. Colossians 2:6-7 puts it like this: 'so then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness'.

The 5 Ms - Magnification, Mission, Membership, Maturity and Ministry - break this journey down into stages, each one building and overlapping with the others. Together, they remind us how God works to build his church. They also help us to focus holistically on people and all aspects of our ongoing journey: from seeing people saved to helping them continue as mature disciples of Jesus.

The 5 M purpose model has been adopted and used at WWEC since 2011. It ultimately enables us to be intentional as we seek to live out the Great Commission to make disciples, and the Great Commandment to love God and each other.



MAGNIFICATION Glorifying God by loving, worshipping and delighting in Him.

MEMBERSHIP

Connected into the church family to express our unity in Christ.

MATURITY

Transformed by God's word to honour Him and love others.

MISSION Glorifying God by sharing the gospel of grace.

MINISTRY

Equipping the church family to use their whole lives in service of God and each other.

God continues to grow our numbers at WWEC both through the miracle of newborn babies (6 in total) and through others joining our church. In 2023, we had 75 people fill in C&C cards and marked

"I'm new". After follow-up from our Welcoming Team, it was great to see that 30 of these people became regular members of our church family. These people have joined us from different places and for different reasons; 15 moved to Wagga, 10 relocated from other churches in Wagga, and 5 coming along to church for the first time. We also have added another 28 people to our contact list (people who have visited WWEC and come along occasionally). We prayerfully hope to see these people connect and matured in their faith in 2024.

While it's great to welcome newcomers, it's also sad to see people leave our church family. In 2023 we saw 20 adults leave; 12 moved away from Wagga and 8 to other churches in Wagga. Regardless of the reason people may have to leave Wagga or WWEC, one of our core values is that they leave better equipped to be ministers of the gospel, wherever they go.

As our church family grows, the complexity of welcoming people, helps to establish new relationships. Our Membership Team continues to adjust to meet these needs. Mitch Kingsland has stepped in to lead our Welcoming Teams for 9am and 11am with a bunch of faithful team members who lead our congregations by example: Trudy Riley continues to coordinate generous volunteers who serve at Joint Morning Teas and Lunch@Ours. Rebekah Wade has stepped in to coordinate other catered events, such as our AGM, Training Lunches, Newish, Jesus-Seriously?! etc. Be sure to read the experiences of people who have been part of these Membership activities.

One of the other real Membership highlights of 2023 has been the way that CAF (Care and Assist Fund) has been utilised as a tangible, material support for people in our church family. The skills auction, used to raise money for an assistance dog for Patrick Fallon, was an excellent example. The night raised over \$15,000 through the generous donations of skills and money from within our church family and meant that training of Pat's future dog has commenced.

PARTNERSHIP

Members who have attended WWEC for some time are invited by the Senior Pastor to consider becoming formal Partners. Being a Partner of WWEC is about committing to the mission of our church through prayer, service and financial support. Partners also have the responsibility for appointing people to fill offices and to vote at formal meetings. In 2023 we had seven (7) members join us as partners. Two (2) partners left WWEC as they moved from Wagga. At the end of 2023 we had 83 partners. For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others (Romans 12:4,5).

MEMBERSHIP

Welcoming Team

Many visitors have described WWEC as a 'welcoming' church – praise God! But what does that mean? Is it just about handing out bulletins and talking to newcomers? Or is there more to it than that? I have been thinking through these questions since taking on the role of Welcoming Team Leader this year. In particular, I have been reviewing our process for connecting newcomers into our church family and establishing pathways to help this happen more smoothly. I have also developed a new welcome card which can be given out to newcomers. The idea was to have something that is small and simple, but also communicates the important information about WWEC – who we are and what we do. I pray that we will continue to be a church that genuinely welcomes others and that we will welcome many new people into our church family in 2024..

SERMON SERIES

God speaks to us through his word, the Bible, which makes us wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus (2 Timothy 3:15). For this reason the Bible is at the centre of all we do because it helps us make and mature disciples of Jesus. Thus we structure everything we do around God's word, prayerfully desiring to see people grow deeper in knowledge, love and service of God. Our aim is to teach the Bible expositionally, dealing with whole books of the Bible at a time. We continue to plan our Bible teaching calendar a year in advance to ensure that we are listening to the whole counsel of God including different genres, historical contexts and authors. In 2023, we finished a series in 2 Corinthians, dug deep in 11 Psalms, worked through Titus and Joshua and continued Luke's gospel.

One of the sermon series that really challenged me was the study of Joshua. I learned that the book of Joshua is about God's faithfulness and how in response to that, God's people must respond by serving God. In this series, I learned that we need to be careful to always be obedient to God, to stay on a straight path, meditate on the law day and night, fear God and rid ourselves of idols. Joshua reminded me that God always keeps his promises (Joshua 21:45) and we should meditate upon those promises (John 14:1-3). What a peace it is to know we have the privilege to love and serve the one and only true God- who always keeps his promises!

PREACHING GROUP



JESUS SERIOUSLY?!


Jesus Seriously?! is the dominant focus of the Mission Teams activities. It is WWEC's evangelistic course where people who are considering faith can explore further the claims of Jesus and ask all their questions. Each Jesus Seriously course runs for five sessions. Tim Flint who hosts the Jesus Seriously courses states, 'Jesus Seriously...it doesn't cost you anything! It's your chance to come and weigh the historical claims, to get behind the hype and the heresy, and work out 'what has Jesus said, what has he done, is it fair-dinkum and what difference does it make?'. At WWEC we long for many more in Wagga to place their trust in Jesus and pray God will use the Jesus Seriously course to bring about His plans. **Quick Stats**

MISSION

The mind of the prudent acquires knowledge. And the ear of the wise seeks knowledge Prov 18:15

Mission remains a primary focus at WWEC. Our Mission Team exists to provide avenues for our church members to get involved in the task of being 'on mission' personally and corporately. The team also seeks to promote and develop genuine Gospel partnerships with Christian ministries outside of WWEC.

As a church family WWEC partners with other Christians and organisations in God's mission – locally, nationally and overseas. We have been blessed financially and want to be faithful stewards of that money, spreading the gospel by supporting the work of ministries that share in our vision of seeing others grow in Christ for God's glory. We commit to a personal partnership that is expressed through prayer, financial support & practical assistance. Currently WWEC commits 11% of our annual budget toward our mission partners.

It is the WWEC Mission teams responsibility to select and manage WWEC's mission partnerships. Each year they review the current WWEC mission partners, and either renew partnerships or select new partnerships based on key criteria. They ensure we have a mix of partners who work in three key areas: proclaiming God's word globally, show God's love to those near and far and equipping the church. The Mission team ensure mission partnership news is relayed to our church family so we can pray collectively (& individually) for our fellow gospel partners.

The Mission Partners for 2023 included:

- **Pioneers:** Blair Family: sharing the gospel amongst people groups in South Western Sydney amongst refugees and new migrants
- Australian Fellowship of Evangelical Students (AFES) Wagga Wagga campus: supporting Christian students & sharing the gospel at CSU in Wagga
- Fellowship of Independent Evangelical Churches (FIEC) planting new churches and grow existing churches
- Singleton Evangelical Church supporting the work of a church plant in a small rural town
- **Special Religious Education (SRE)** Wagga Wagga contributing to a ministry which aims to share the news of the gospel within the public schools of Wagga
- Voice of the Martyrs: helping and encouraging persecuted Christians by providing Bibles, ministry resources, medical aid, practical assistance and advocacy
- Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF) Newth Family: serving isolated people by using aircraft to bring in the essentials of life as well as medical care, emergency food, and Christian hope
- Local Leaders International supporting theological colleges in the developing world, to train a steady supply of competent Christian leaders.

PERSONAL EVANGELISM

MINISTRY

What an exciting year we had in ministry in 2023! Praise God for all the gifts and abilities with which He has blessed our church family. It was amazing to see people really stepping up and jumping into all the ministries that make our church run. Our desire is that everyone will be involved in service at church, as each of us has been uniquely gifted to help build up the body. There really is a place for everyone in ministry.

By the end of 2023 we had 15 ministry teams, with 137 people actively involved in serving. Our goal has been to move from a roster based system to a teams based ministry system where teams take ownership over their ministry area and can support, train and disciple each other as they use their gifts to build the kingdom. With this in mind we have been encouraging people to serve in one area of ministry and really commit to just that area rather than serving across multiple areas.

- <u>Morning tea</u> has been exceptional and growing as 2023 progressed. I have particularly enjoyed the delicious home made snacks lovingly prepared and brought around after the service. There was also several "Joint Morning Teas" throughout the year where we enjoyed fellowship together between the services.
 - Our **roadies**, **open up**, **set up and pack up** teams have reorganised their roles and times which has streamlined the process of setting up church on a Sunday morning. We now have a storage slider for the kids and youth storage which has significantly improved storage space and usability for our teams.
 - Our <u>computer team</u> has had several new recruits join and continues to make improvements to how our AV systems operate.
 - Our <u>music teams</u> continue to grow. It is lovely to see some talented youth coming in to serve in our church in this ministry. Recently we have purchased EMU music's Hymnbook program which is excellent.
 - Our <u>sound</u> has continued to prove challenging. The school generously allows us to use their equipment but this means that there are many factors which contribute to the state of the system on a Sunday morning. Praise God for the many new knowledgeable and skilled recruits to this vital ministry, we look forward to them finding solutions to make sound a much more reliable aspect of our ministry.

Growth in all areas always comes with changes and challenges. All of our ministries could do with more volunteers so please continue to pray that everyone who calls WWEC home will have a heart for serving as we work together to make and mature disciples of Jesus in Wagga Wagga.

MINISTRY

In 2023 we developed a new pattern for our ministry training.

In **Term 1** we had our main in-house team training lunch (kids and youth on one day and all other ministry areas on another).

In **Term 4** we held an end of year lunch for team leaders where we reflected on 2023 and planned for 2024. We encouraged our teams to also catch up socially to celebrate God's work in ministry at WWEC in 2023.

We are really thankful to God for our wonderful ministry Team Leaders and their enthusiasm and commitment to lead teams and ministries.

What a privilege, honour and joy it has been to be able to serve our great God and Saviour alongside wonderful brothers and sisters in Christ this year.





RECRUITMENT

It's been a real joy to work alongside Mike in recruiting people to serve in ministry this year. As we have begun to move to teams-based serving, I have often been stopped in my tracks wondering how are we going to fill each team with the right volunteers- time and time again, I have been amazed at how God has both gifted our body and compelled our members to willingly step into roles to be trained, equipped and unleashed to use their gifts in volunteer ministries each week. In 2023 there has been an additional 25-30 WWEC members join serving teams. This has included those who have been coming to WWEC for 3-6 months, have attended Newish, partaking in a ministry interview and then being trained by a Team Leader. MTS- MITCH KINGSLAND

In 2023, I had the opportunity to begin a 2-year ministry apprenticeship through Ministry Training Strategy (MTS). My goal for the apprenticeship has been to work out whether or not I should pursue a life of full-time ministry - a goal which I am still working towards.

My experience so far has been overwhelmingly positive! I have really enjoyed being freed up to do ministries that I enjoy, such as Youth Group and SRE. I have also had the opportunity to try new things such as preaching, service leading and welcoming. All of these things have given me a good grasp of the behind-the-scenes work that is required to reach the people of Wagga with the gospel.

Whilst I haven't completed any formal study during my apprenticeship, we have been working our way through the MTS Curriculum - a series of discussion papers which address many aspects of theology and ministry. Discussing these articles weekly has sharpened my understanding of the 'why' and the 'how' of ministry.

Through MTS, God has also been challenging me and showing me my weaknesses. For example, I have learned that ministry is all

about people. As someone who loves being organised, I have realised that leading a team is not all about calendars and emails. It's about helping people be captured by the goodness and the urgency of the gospel. I have also learned that God is a generous Dad who cares for His children. Having a lower income this year has brought about challenges, but also great joys as we have seen God come through for us time and time again. I am really looking forward to my second year of MTS in 2024. Please be praying for our family, particularly as we make decisions about what's next.

Develop our team culture by supporting, equipping, training and encouraging one another in service.



KIDS & YOUTH CHURCH

KIDS CHURCH K-5

Our K-5 group had also grown significantly during the year, particularly in the 9am service, and this required the doubling of leaders for this group so that they could split in two for the teaching time. In 2024 we are looking to move to separate K-2 and 3-5 groups at 9am to best care for and teach our children. Our kids' church writers have continued to do an amazing job writing bespoke lessons following along with our sermon series so that families can discuss together what they have been learning.

PRESCHOOL

At the end of 2023 our Preschoolers group expanded to the point where we required extra leaders rostered on each week. During 2023 the review and revamp of the Preschoolers program was completed. We give thanks to all those involved in completing this large task. It was a huge effort by those involved and has yielded great results with a program that is clear, Biblically faithful and pitched well to the Preschool age range. We will continue to review and sharpen these lessons as time goes on.





YOUTH CHURCH

Youth Church has been growing and now has a separate team of leaders looking after 9 and 11. It has been wonderful to see the growth in maturity of the kids in this group as they continue to ask great questions and respond to the great teaching program which continues to evolve.

LISTEN & PLAY

At the end of 2023, we set up a live video link to our Listen & Play room (creche) so that parents are able to see as well as hear the sermon whilst caring for their babies. This has really improved how we are looking after this growing group and has been greatly appreciated by parents.





KIDS & YOUTH CHURCH

Train children in the way they should go; when they grow old. They won't depart from it. Proverbs 22:6

I can't exactly remember when I joined the Preschool Church Ministry at WWEC but it was in the foundational years of our church and well before I had children of my own. We now have so many children joining us, from different backgrounds- some of whom hear the gospel at home and others who do not. Our biggest challenge in recent years has been having enough leaders to accommodate the volume of children so that lessons are meaningful. Our focus in Preschool Church is pretty simple; teach the gospel to the little ones and leave the growing to God! It's so encouraging to seeing children at this age putting Bible verses to memory and learning God's plan of salvation from the Old Testament to the New. The questions they ask and the connections they make never fail to encourage me. Serving in this way helps my own children understand the commitment it is to be in a church family. FINANCE REPORT

GIVING


At WWEC our income comes from the generosity of regular church members supporting our church financially. In 2023 the Administration Committee determined that the giving required to meet budget was \$36,580 per month. This amount would allow us to be 'budget neutral' at the end of the year (ie cover all budgeted expenses).

This was an increase from the previous year of \$3,720 because we employed our 3rd pastor.

INCOME

Praise God for the generosity of his people here at WWEC. Throughout 2023 we exceeded our required income in 10 of 12 months. Our actual average income per month was \$39,262. This meant that at the end of 2023 we had received \$32,185 more than we budgeted for.




EXPENDITURE

In 2023 the budget for WWEC needed to cover 3 pastoral staff wages along with the costs of running church. Detailed information about these costs can be found in the supplementary documents to this report (see 2023 Budget). In 2023 our planned expenditure was approximately \$438,876. Our actual expenses totalled \$422,675 (note: this takes into account income for specific budget items eg. Youth group).

Goals for 2023

- To receive an income of \$43,500 per month from our regular members.
- This is an increase from what we received in 2023 of \$4,238 per month.
- With this money we can cover all of our church expenses AND invest in growing God's Kingdom through staff and/or property in future years.

WWEC COMMITTEES

ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE

WWEC's Administration Committee is charged with the responsibility of managing the financial and legal affairs on behalf of the members of WWEC. The committee met on a bi-monthly basis (six times) during 2023. Unfortunately due to unforeseen circumstances we were unable to host our usual online meeting with WWEC's Board of Reference in 2023.

The committee met to pray and consider a number of issues in relation to the financial and operational needs of WWEC. In 2023 agenda items included; WWEC's budget, policies and procedures (including the adoption of a new guideline and procedure), MTS, staff support, safe church, incident reporting and management, partnership, venue needs, WWEC's AGM, staff continuing professional development, resourcing, finance and staff planning.

Minutes of the Administration Committee meetings can be inspected by partners upon request to the Secretary of the Administration Committee. WWEC's current Policies, Procedures & Guidelines, our Code of Conduct and Constitution can be accessed on our website: <u>wwec.org.au</u> under 'resources'.

The Board are available to WWEC with the power to mediate a dispute or even call a General Meeting to resolve serious issues. Details of the 2023 BOR are below.

FUTURE FOCUS

Senior Pastor - Tim Flint

What a big year we've had under God's hand! Hopefully as you've read through this report you get a sense of the story God has been writing through His people at Wagga Wagga Evangelical Church. As I read, reflect and pray about all that has happened in the last year, I'm immediately excited about the future that lay ahead- and there's lots to consider.

The first big step forward is to trial the governance changes that I suggested at the AGM in 2023 (ie. the introduction of an *Advisory Committee*). Though significant time was spent shaping and tweaking these suggested changes with the help of a consult group, the implementation of a trial period was set back due to my ill health mid-year. I'm excited to see this move forward in 2024 and am confident that we will be in a good position to adjudicate the benefit of these changes by 2025.

At our staff planning retreat in October 2023, we spent significant time clarifying our *Purpose* (why we exist as a church), our *Vision* (what we want to see as a result of our existence), and our *Values* (core principles that underpin what and how we do everything).

Purpose: to make and mature disciples of Jesus **Vision**: to see disciples of Jesus made and matured in increasing number **Values**: as per the outline on the adjoining page

I'm keen for everyone at WWEC to know, love and share this Purpose, this Vision and these Values. They need to be the constant reference point for reminding us why we do things at WWEC and the framework for deciding what we say "Yes" or "No" to in the future.

It's being clear on these that also help shape another significant future step that I want us to be prayerfully taking in 2024. As I look at our growth rate at WWEC, I'm both blown away by what God has done and terrified about the implications if this trend continues! We have the really excellent problem of needing to consider both property needs and pastoral staffing needs to cater for future growth. The simple equation is that we will need both (more staff and a plan for property), in the close future. The big decision for 2024 is to navigate the particularities of these needs and the priority order. Though this is very daunting for me as the Senior Pastor, I'm really encouraged by the generosity of our church family which means that even considering these needs has become far more realistic in the last 12 months. As you have hopefully noted, our monthly giving in 2023 exceeded our budgeted spending- praise God the generosity of His people...you! This has given the Administration Committee a solid basis from which to begin exploring future options and this will be a focus in 2024. Whenever I speak about *church growth*, I always want to clarify- we don't, and shouldn't, seek church growth for our glory sake- we want to see the church grow because more people are being made and matured as disciples of Jesus...for His glory! Should God keep us at our present size...praise be to Him! My sincere encouragement to all of us is to continue to be prayerful, faithful and fruitful in the work that God has invited us to be co-workers in (1 Corinthians 3:5ff), and therefore to be confident that God will continue to grow His church in both number and depth of maturity.

Praying for the Future

- Please pray for the trial implementation of the proposed governance changes (Advisory Committee). Pray for wisdom to assess these changes well, regardless of whether that means formally making, future tweaking or totally scraping the changes altogether!
- Pray that the clarification of our *Purpose*, *Vision* and *Values* will have a galvanising effect on us as a church family as we get on with the task of making and maturing disciples of Jesus, together.
- Pray for wisdom for the pastoral staff, Administration Committee and the Advisory Committee as we consider decisions about the needs for future staffing and plans for property.
